



Village of Chester hires interim Clerk/Treasurer

Dennis Egyedy, Village of Chester Clerk/Treasurer, resigned effective April 27, 2022

The Commissioners and Village thank Dennis for his contributions during his time as Clerk Treasurer and wish him well.

There are several ongoing issues that require, by legislation, the involvement of a Clerk/Treasurer, in particular the upcoming June Election and the contract for demolition of the former Windjammer Motel. Finalizing the 2021/2022 Audit and the 2022-2023 Budget process are also important elements on the current agenda.

During the election there will be 4 Commissioner positions to be filled as a result of the end of term for Michael Heisler and Martin Hiltz, and as a result of the unfortunate death of Commissioner Bill Nauss, and the resignation of Commissioner Michael Dockerill.

It will be important for the newly elected Commission to have an opportunity to set the strategic direction for the future and define what staff requirements are required to support that direction. We are pleased that Jeff Conrad has agreed to join the Village as Interim Clerk/Treasurer for a period of up to 6 months, which will allow the new Commission the flexibility to define the role and fill it as they see appropriate.

Jeff started work May 16. He is a resident of Chester Basin and is married with two adult children. He brings more than 30 years of combined experience with the Government of Canada and the Province of Nova Scotia. Jeff retired in 2019 from a role as a Deputy Minister with the Provincial government.

Jeff's salary for the six-month period is \$35,000.
